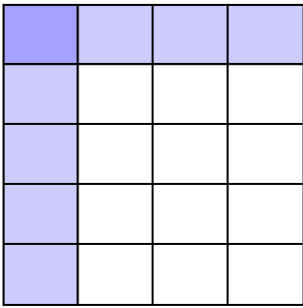


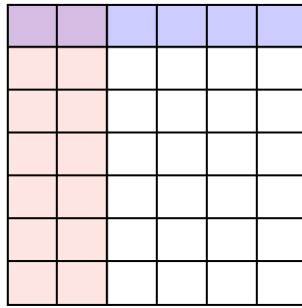


Use the box provided to show a visual example of how to multiply two fractions.

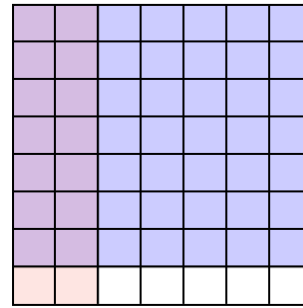
Ex) $\frac{1}{4} \times \frac{1}{5} =$



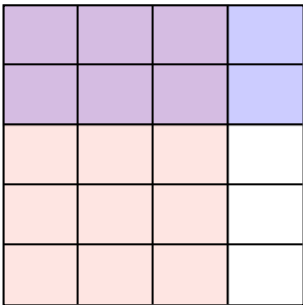
1) $\frac{2}{6} \times \frac{1}{7} =$



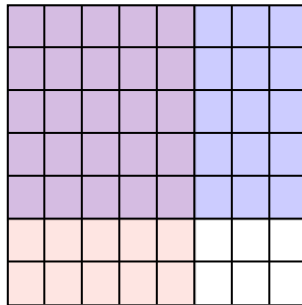
2) $\frac{2}{7} \times \frac{7}{8} =$



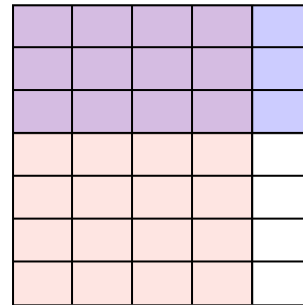
3) $\frac{3}{4} \times \frac{2}{5} =$



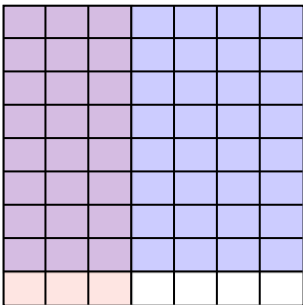
4) $\frac{5}{8} \times \frac{5}{7} =$



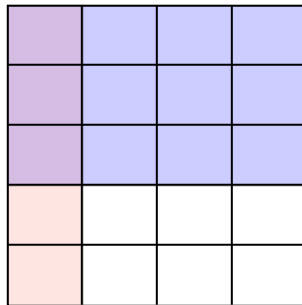
